Tools 4 Seminole Schools collects and distributes school supplies and classroom materials to teachers. who in turn ensure their students have what they need to participate and succeed. With over half of Seminole County's students qualifying for free or reduced meals, the need for this type of support is undisputed.

Conveniently located near the 417 and SR46A in Sanford, the store offers easy access and weekend hours to teachers county-wide. In 2021, teachers shopped at the store nearly 1,900 times. Teachers received an average of \$469 worth of free supplies each shop -- putting everything from pencils and binders to socks and

hygiene packs in the hands of students who need it most.

As a core Foundation program, T4SS also provides an excellent way for the community to connect and support those most in need. Through local supply drives and team volunteer days, community partners come together for a hands-on experience while giving back.

Take Stock in Children **CHANGING LIVES, ONE STUDENT AT A TIME**



Take Stock In Children -Seminole (TSIC) provides an educational pathway for academically-qualified, lowincome, underrepresented students. Since 1995, the program has sought to end the poverty cycle by helping



at-risk children graduate from high school, complete college, and become productive citizens. Our program begins the summer after 8th grade and includes wraparound services such as weekly mentor sessions, workshops, interventions by Foundation staff, and the promise of a 2-year Florida Prepaid Foundation Scholarship upon graduation.

In 2021, 100% of our Take Stock seniors graduated in four years and 44% of them obtained supplemental scholarships to stack on top of their Florida Prepaid Scholarship. These statistics shatter the standard expectations for students with similar backgrounds receiving no additional support. Our program is growing. It currently serves 104 students, up from 88 five years ago.

Thanks to an app developed by TSIC statewide leadership, the vital connections between mentors and students happen regardless of virtual or in-person status. Our 2,000+ mentor sessions, in conjunction with skill-building workshops and support by our on-staff college readiness coach, ensure that students stay on track for success.

Families In Need Program SUPPORTING SCPS INITIATIVES

Recognizing upward trends in homelessness, food insecurity, and decreased incomes, the district has ramped up the call for help with its most vulnerable population. We are proud of our role to help to answer that call. With 32,000 low-income and over 1,300 homeless students throughout Seminole County, there is a clear need to provide timely, targeted support.

The Families In Need (FIN) program provides services to



remove educational barriers due to homelessness, poverty, and/or abuse. The program provides case management to unaccompanied homeless youth, essential resources such as food, hygiene supplies, transportation, and more to students in need, and refers families to other community agency partners for additional services. The objective is for students and families to reach stability, so they can return to their most important and empowering job – learning.

At the request of district leadership, the Foundation's role in raising awareness and support for FIN's programming has expanded. Last year, we started a new partnership with Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida to provide pre-packed weekend food bags to students at several high need schools. Through the solicitation of grants and private donors, the Foundation directed \$110,000 to FIN last year.
